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SNAP Employment and Training

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Employment & Training (SNAP E&T) prepares SNAP (formerly referred to as "Food Stamps") recipients for employment through work-related education and training activities.

Any SNAP recipient that does not receive TANF benefits can volunteer for the SNAP E&T program. Able-Bodied Adults without Dependents (ABAWDs) can also meet their 20 hour Federal work/ activity requirement by participating with SNAP E&T.



We are here to help you increase your skills and/or education so you can find the career you have always wanted.



SNAP E&T Participants will receive Supportive Services to cover **ALL** costs related to the education or training program you choose.

Tennessee Board of Regents Free Training/Certifications

The Tennessee Board of Regents (TBR) system provides a variety of training and certifications for in-demand occupations through their network of 27 Tennessee Colleges of Applied Technology (TCAT) and 13 Community Colleges across the state.

Training Courses include, but aren't limited to:

- Healthcare
- Computer Information Technology
- Welding Technology
- Truck Driving
- Mechanics
- Many additional options

Current students may become eligible for SNAP benefits, by participating in the SNAP E&T program, if other eligibility requirements are met by the Department of Human Services.

Tennessee Adult Education Offers:

- High School Equivalency prep classes during the day, at night and on the weekends
- Online classes for Distance Learners
- Basic computer skills
- Workforce Preparation
- Individualized and small group instruction
- English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

Adult Education supportive services include: Transportation; Books; Cost of HiSET (High School Equivalency Test); and more

Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act

The **Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)** is a federal program designed to help job seekers access employment, education, training, and support services to succeed in the labor market and to match employers with the skilled workers they need to compete in the global economy.

Opportunities for SNAP E&T Participants include:

WIOA Youth Services for Ages 16-24

Occupational Skills training; Paid/Unpaid work experience; Tutoring; Leadership Development; and follow-up services for at least 12 months.

WIOA Adults and Dislocated Workers

Occupational Skills training, Paid/Unpaid work experience, On the Job training, and Subsidized Employment Opportunities.

WIOA Skill Building

Complete short term trainings in 6 -18 weeks or complete college readiness courses to prepare you for secondary training.

WIOA Career Development

Receive individualized coaching to assist you in finding employment quickly.



WIOA supportive services include: Tuition and fees; books; equipment and tools for training; uniforms; transportation; and other expenses directly related to your program
